






Figurative Language

Nigel and the Moon Discussion Questions



Before Reading:

- What do you think the boy on the cover is doing?
- Where do you think this story takes place?
- Do you think this story is fiction or nonfiction? How can you tell?
- Make a prediction about what will happen in this story.

While Reading:

- On page 2, why do you think Nigel feels his dreams are safe with the moon?
- The book says, "...his class shadows their parents at work." What do you think that means?
 - Look at the illustrations. Can you tell what her job is?
- How does Nigel feel about sharing his dreams with the class? How can you tell?

After Reading:

- Why do you think Nigel was nervous about his parents coming to career day?
- How did Nigel's feelings about his parent's careers change after he saw his classmates' reactions?
- Make a text to self connection. Think about a time you felt nervous sharing something in front of a group of people.
- What did this story remind you of?
- What lesson does this story teach?
- What do you want to be when you grow up?

Nigel and the Moon Discussion Questions

Before Reading:


- What medium did the illustrator use to design the book cover?
- Make a prediction about the setting. Why do you think it takes place in that location?
- How does the cover make you feel? Predict the tone of the story.

While Reading:

- On page 3, make a prediction about what Nigel's dream may be.
- The book says, "...his class shadows their parents at work." What does it mean to shadow somebody? Why do you think this term is used? Why might they be shadowing their parents?
 - Use context clues to determine his mother's profession. How can you tell what she does?
- What does it mean to *quiver*? Why do you think Nigel 'quivers at the thought' of telling the world his dreams?
- Why do you think Nigel feels more comfortable telling the moon his hopes and dreams versus his classmates?

After Reading:

- Recall figurative language from the story. What did you visualize?
- Identify symbolism you noticed in the illustrations and/or text.
- Describe foreshadowing the author and/or illustrator used to hint at Nigel's parents' professions.
- Determine one theme within the story. Use text evidence to support your thinking.
- What lesson did you take away from this story?

- Which classroom job is your favorite? Why?
- Write a list of 5 things you'd like to be when you grow up. Rank them with 1 being what you'd like to be most.
- What do you want to be when you grow up? Draw a picture and explain why you'd choose this job.
- Write a letter to Nigel. Include advice and questions for him.
- Write about a part of the story that surprised you. What were you expecting to happen instead?
- Summarize the story using first, next, then, and last.

Use these low prep and no print activities at home and school.

1. Charades

Directions:

- Students think about what they want to be when they grow up.
- One volunteer comes to the front of the class at a time and acts out a task of their chosen profession.
- The student that guesses the profession correctly goes next.

2. Draw Your Dreams

Directions:

- Grab a large sheet of butcher or anchor chart paper.
- Students draw, or write, a dream they have on the paper.
- Hang up in your classroom to inspire them throughout the year.
